Computers, laptops, printers, televisions, computer peripherals, fax machines, DVD players, VCRs and other video players (i.e., DVRs), phones with video displays, etc.

The Material Recovery Facility (MRF) has been retrofitted to process recyclables in a single-stream. No need to separate.

Dispose of all recyclables in the <u>same bin</u> (no recyclables in <u>plastic</u> bags).

Rinse containers (need not remove labels), combine with paper items, flattened cardboard, metals & glass.

ASEPTIC BOXES &

<u>PAPER CARTONS</u>: soup, milk, broth, orange juice, soy milk, etc. Remove caps. Don't remove spouts. Empty, rinse and flatten.

NO STYROFOAM!



DO NOT put the following #3 - #7 PLASTICS at the curb.

<u>DO</u> bring them to the <u>Transfer</u> | Facility to recycle for <u>free</u>:

plastic 55-gallon drums (triple rinse),
large plastic furniture (chairs, tables, etc.)
& large plastic toys (playhouses, slides, etc.).

CONTINUE to Recycle The Following Items:









<u>PAPERS</u>: Office paper, Junk mail, Envelopes (with or without windows), Catalogs, Magazines, Newspapers, Phonebooks, Paperback books, and Paper bags. Flatten <u>all</u>: Paper egg cartons, Containerboard, Cardboard, Rolls & Tubes

CANS: **Aluminum** (do not crush), **Steel** (push partially attached lid into can)

PLASTIC: Bottles, Jugs & All Plastics # 1 - 7

GLASS: Jars and Bottles, (No window glass)

<u>BRING</u> the following items to the Portage County <u>Transfer</u> Facility: Some have a fee, others are free. All are recycled!

Automotive Fluids ~ Appliances ~ Electronics ~ Fluorescent Bulbs Ballasts ~ Batteries ~ Scrap Metals ~ Tires

Plastic film, shrink wrap or bags (any #); <u>Brown</u> #1 plastic; Plastic straws, plates, silverware; Drink pouches; Frozen food containers; Food; <u>Styrofoam</u> (egg cartons, hot beverage cups, plates, formed packing pieces, or packing peanuts); Foam/Polystyrene; Aluminum foil & baking pans; Metal or plastic liners; Motor oil containers; Light bulbs; Mirrors; Window glass; Ceramics; Clay pots; Tissue products; Paper towels; Soiled paper; Dirty cardboard; CD cases; Vinyl (siding, etc.).
