### From the Office of Village President:

What may be changing in Whiting: At the February 8, 2022 Whiting Village Board meeting, the Board passed a resolution requesting the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC) authorize a change in the location of Whiting property taxpayer's Public Fire Protection (PFP) charge. After the change, the PFP charge will appear on each customer's quarterly utility bill. This is referred to as a Direct Charge. At the same time, these PFP charges would be removed from the Municipal Tax Levy, which is referred to as a Municipal Charge. Therefore, under this change, the charge for PFP would no longer be included in the taxpayer's annual property tax bill.

What is the thinking behind the change: The Whiting Utilities Committee, Whiting Finance Committee, our water department staff, and your Whiting Board of Trustees have spent considerable time in fact-finding and discussion leading up to this change. They've determined this move is logical and will be more efficient. The PFP charge represents 21% of our Village's annual budget. Removing the PFP charge from the tax levy is expected to give the Village more fiscal management flexibility in the future. This should help us better face the challenges of meeting the needs of our citizens in the coming years.

This new system will also bring about greater equity in paying for Public Fire Protection in the Village. Currently, any properties in our community that are exempt from paying property taxes also do not pay for PFP (since it's now collected as part of the tax levy). After the new payment method is implemented, ALL metered properties in Whiting will pay a Public Fire Protection charge since it will be part of the quarterly water/sewer bill.

Just exactly what is Public Fire Protection: Each Whiting property taxpayer currently pays a PFP charge. This PFP charge is required by state law and is regulated by the PSC. In reality, we could call this a "public fire protection water charge" since it has nothing to do with operating a fire department. This is money that goes solely to the Whiting Water Utility and ensures that our water system is equipped with the pumps, storage facilities, water mains, and hydrants to deliver the significant water volume and pressure needed during fire-fighting and still supply daily water needs to our customers.

**What's next:** We are using the services of our present auditing firm to help prepare and submit Whiting's application for this change to the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin. After their initial review and the mandatory water rate case study, a public hearing will be held before the Commission renders their decision on the Village's request. If approved by the PSC, Whiting taxpayers will eventually begin seeing the PFP charge on their quarterly water/sewer bill.

All Whiting taxpayers will be mailed a public hearing notice, detailing the date and agenda for this PSC hearing. In addition, you'll be receiving updates in the quarterly Village newsletter. - Due to redistricting in 2021, residents east of Post Rd are in County Supervisory District 17. Everyone else (including Minnesota and Vivian Lane) are in District 9. County Board of Supervisor races will be on the April 5th ballot.

### **Reassessment Scheduled for 2022**

All property with and without buildings located in the Village of Whiting will be reassessed in 2022. Those results will be reflected on your December 2022 tax bills. The last time the reassessment process took place was in 2014.

For most property owners, the reassessment will not require admittance into the property of buildings by the assessor. A small portion of properties will need an inspection. The assessor will notify those property owners ahead of time if needed.

Reassessment generally increases the property value but the mill rate decreases. This doesn't necessarily mean that your property taxes will be going up. In fact, unless there are budgetary needs that require increases to the tax levy, most property owners will see little change in their property tax bill.

All of this can be a bit confusing. It is my goal to conduct a fair and equitable process. If you have questions concerning the assessment, you can contact me any time.
