A note from the Director:

Summer is here, and I am enjoying the sounds of lawn mowers instead of snowblowers after a winter that seemed to drag on long past its welcome. With that in mind, I would like to take a moment to share some information about village ordinances regarding yard maintenance. Grass growing on parcels of land or lots within the village must be mowed regularly and kept at a length less than 8 inches tall. This is in an attempt to control noxious weeds and limit pollen emissions which may have adverse health effects for some individuals. More information on this subject can be found in chapter 32 of our municipal code. I would also like to take a moment and remind you about road right-of-way's and how to go about performing an activity within this area, such as landscaping. A right-of-way is a term for the strip of land that is required for the placement of roads, shoulders, sidewalks, and utilities (gas, electric, water, sewer, and communication). The width of road right-of-ways vary from street to street, and can even vary as you travel down a given street. The important part to remember is that in most all cases, the right-of-way is significantly wider than the width of the roadway itself.

Section 12.04 and 12.05 of our local municipal code discuss the rules and regulations regarding activities in the right-of-way areas. If you are planning a project in the right-of-way area (landscaping, plantings, etc.) there is a permit that is required. Please contact our building inspector to apply for a permit. Please also feel free to contact me if you have questions about right-of-way locations or require information on what is allowed within this area.

PFAS (per-and polyfluoroalkyl substances) UPDATE

The Village of Whiting takes its role in protecting public health by providing safe drinking water to our community very seriously. Our drinking water is closely regulated by both the EPA and DNR and it meets strict Federal and State drinking water standards. We appreciate that an important conversation is happening right now regarding PFAS. PFAS is an emerging contaminant that EPA and DNR do not regulate at this time. PFAS is a group of thousands of compounds used in everything from food packaging and cookware to upholstery, clothing and firefighting foam. These chemicals do not break down in the environment and are commonly found in dust, air, soil and water. It is our understanding that PFAS can be found everywhere. Testing for PFAS is not required by state or federal regulators, but our utility has tested for PFAS and found that our water contained less than 1 part per trillion (ppt) of two different chemicals from within this group of chemicals. No other chemicals from this group were detected. EPA and DNR are both working to determine how and when PFAS should be regulated in the future. We will continue to follow EPA's and DNR's lead on PFAS to keep your drinking water safe according to the Safe Drinking Water Act.
