UTILITY PAYMENT REMINDERS

- If you are a **Direct Pay Customer**, your payment will automatically be taken out between the 15th and 19th of the month. You will still receive a quarterly bill in the mail stating the amount being taken out of your bank account.

- Due to many mail delays lately, try to mail payments early so they reach us by the due date of January 20. We also have the night deposit option.

Important Reminders:

- Dog and Cat licenses for 2023 can be purchased at village hall or the Humane Society. You have until March 31 to avoid a \$5.00 late fee. Neutered/spayed animals \$12.00. If not neutered or spayed, \$22.00. Cash or check needed for payment. Thank you!
- **First Installment of Property taxes due Jan 31**. Refer to information sent with your tax bill for payment options. All payments are made through Portage County. Website: https://www.co.portage.wi.us/department/treasurer-s-office-home-page
- We are recycling Christmas lights and still accepting candles all year
- **2023 Elections**: February 21 and April 4. If you need to **register** or want to receive **absentee ballots**, go to https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/ or stop in the office to fill out an application.

WINTERTIME REMINDERS

- Property owners and occupants are responsible for removing snow and ice from sidewalks within 24 hours after the snowfall ceases. There is no minimum snowfall amount rule. All snow needs to be cleared. (Village ordinance 12.07)
- Removing snow from private property and depositing on sidewalks, streets or other public places is prohibited.
- Do you live near a fire hydrant? Please help us to keep it clear of snow. This will allow the fire department quicker access during emergencies. Your assistance is greatly appreciated.
- When ice has formed and cannot be immediately removed, residents should use salt, sawdust or sand to cover the area.
- Sand barrels are available on corner of Verrill and School St., behind the Village Hall and on the corner of Cherry and West Cedar.
- The Village of Whiting is not responsible for any damage that may occur within the Village's right-of-way as a result of the snow and ice removal operations. This includes damage to snow sticks, gravel/sand, gouged or torn sod, landscapes, irrigation equipment or driveway aprons. Snow sticks should be set back a minimum of 1 foot from the paved part of the road.
